Many of us are starting our garden season by Planting Seeds Indoors. With plenty of light, warmth and the right watering it can be a really inexpensive and satisfying way to garden. Getting the watering right is an important key to success. Here are some tips from:

Water too often and plants are deprived of oxygen and fungus can grow. Water too little and plants can wilt.

Top Watering: Works well before seedlings germinate. Use a mister to spray the surface of the soil.

Bottom Watering: Use a watering can to fill the tray at the bottom of the seedlings & allow the water to soak up through the roots. Drain excess water when soil is fully dampened.

Tips for Successful TOMATO GROWING

- 1 Pick a Sunny Spot 6-8 hrs of sun/day
- 2 Plant Deep!

Plant deeper than plant grew in pot.

Remove bottom leaves.

- 3 Suport!
 - Except for micro tomatoes, all tomatoes need support.
 Use stakes or trellises.
- 4 Mulch to preserve soil moisture & reduce weeds

- 5 Water Carefully & regularly. Don't splash leaves. Not too much, not too little. Check soil first.
- 6 Fertilize & Monitor
 Check for pests & remove.
